Paver Dedication Ceremony

Heritage Walk (east side of museum)



The Memorial Day paver dedication ceremony will feature guest speaker BG David Lesperance, Armor School Commandant at the Maneuver Center of Excellence, as well as brief remarks by U.S. Rep. Sanford Bishop. About 185 commemorative granite pavers will be dedicated, bringing the total number of pavers on Heritage Walk to more than 6,000. Family and friends will have the opportunity to make rubbings following the ceremony.
