Secondary classes can visit the Museum throughout the school year and choose between guided docent-led tours of the Museum or self-guided tours using suggested tour routes for historical overview or fine arts themed tours. Guided tours can be customized to cover particular subjects being covered in the classroom or can be given as an overview of the collection. Each of the suggested tour routes is based on state and national standards and meets curriculum objectives for all grade levels. Guided tours must sign-up and pre-pay at least 3 weeks prior to visit; \$1 per student; ask about the Susan Cochran Memorial Bus Fund and scholarship opportunities. Self-guided tours are **FREE**, but not eligible for the Susan Cochran Memorial Bus Fund.
