Painting with Fire: Works by Betsy Eby On View Through February 23, 2014

Yarbrough Gallery

This exhibition features encaustic paintings by Betsy Eby dating from 2007 through 2012. The medium of encaustic in which she works involves layering heated beeswax and colored pigments using knives, brushes and a blow-torch. The liquid or paste is then applied to a surface such as canvas, wood, or Masonite. Trained as a classical pianist, Eby creates works that capture the movement and rhythms found in music and the natural world around her. **FREE**

Feel the Heat: Contemporary Glass Sculpture

Feel the Heat highlights the different ways in which glass is used as a medium for contemporary art. Assembled from museum and private collections throughout the southeast, Feel the Heat features over 60 works by masters of studio glass. The exhibit explores a variety of techniques used to create glass objects, including blowing, casting, acid-etching, hot-working, slumping, incalmo, and lampworking. FREE
