The Columbus Museum Presents Chattahoochee Cookin'

Columbus, GA – The Columbus Museum is pleased to present *Chattahoochee Cookin'* on view now through September 20, 2015 in the third floor galleries. This exhibit showcases regional agriculture, foodways, and local culinary favorites through the lens of producer and consumers.

Foods highlighted range from Muscogee (Creek) Sofke to contemporary Dinglewood Pharmacy scrambled dogs. Local beverages such as colas and locally distilled liquors are also discussed alongside the shifting landscape of food production through time as depicted in murals from the Georgia Department of Agriculture. The show provides interactive elements for visitors including a play garden for children.

The public is invited to view this exhibition and attend the related programs. Museum Members can enjoy an opening reception, March 31, 6-8 P.M. featuring roundtable discussions led by local food movement experts and farm-to-table cuisine.
