## The Columbus Museum Presents Leaving Mississippi-Reflections on Heroes and Folklore: Works by Najee Dorsey

**Columbus, GA** – **The** Columbus Museum is pleased to present *Leaving Mississippi-Reflections on Heroes and Folklore: Works by Najee Dorsey,* on view August 21, 2014-January 4, 2015 in the Legacy Gallery. This exhibit features mixed-media works showcasing a number of unsung heroes of the Civil Rights movements, participants of civil disobedience in the early 20th century, and folklore legends, including historic figures from Columbus.

Born and raised in the Delta and now a resident of the Columbus area, Najee Dorsey's roots emerge as he pays homage to a cast of colorful characters, historic events, and conditions of Southern life in the exhibit. "In the work I do, I present an American experience through the lens of my African-American perspective", says Dorsey who uses a variety of materials, blending textures and layers, to create commentary about current economic and social conditions in America.
