Child Survivor of Holocaust to Speak at NIM

Ft. Benning's annual Days of Remembrance observance set for April 20

Columbus, Georgia – April 17, 2017: Hershel Greenblat, a child survivor of the Holocaust, will be the guest speaker at Fort Benning's annual Days of Remembrance observance. The event will be held in the National Infantry Museum's theater at 11 a.m. Thursday, April 20, 2017.

Greenblat spent the first two years of his life hidden with his parents and other Jews in the extensive network of caves under the wheat fields of the Ukraine. They lived in constant fear of discovery, and had to forage for food from nearby farms. After the war, the family lived in displaced persons camps, where Greenblat attended school and learned English. He recalls the excitement of receiving Hershey bars from American Soldiers, who he described as the kindest people he'd ever met.

There will be children's artwork commemorating the Holocaust on display in the theater lobby, and McBride Elementary School students will conduct a candle lighting ceremony.
