We will have an evening of "American Icons" featuring music of America (jazz, bluegrass, country, and more) and spoken word from some of our nation's heroes. It's a thrilling opening to a most promising season----a concert not to be missed." For Beethoven fans, it doesn't get any better!

The 7:30 PM concert will feature Swiss-born American pianist Gilles Vonsattel, a second-time performer with the CSO. You may have heard him perform Brahm's "*Piano Concerto No. 1*" at his appearance in our 2004-2005 Season. We are delighted to have him making his return!

"Beethoven's Fifth" is presented by Aflac, 103.7 Litefm, Boomer 102.5, and Columbus Marriott.
