NIM Named Best Free Museum in U.S.! "Victory is Sweet" celebration planned

Columbus, Georgia – September 2, 2016: *The National Infantry Museum and Soldier Center is the Best Free Museum in the United States!* So says USA Today in today's announcement of the winners of the 2016 Readers' Choice Awards.

Voting began in early August after travel experts nominated 20 world-class museums throughout the country for the distinction of Best Free Museum. Throughout the month of voting, the National Infantry Museum and Cleveland Museum of Art fought back and forth for first place. A last-minute surge of support for the NIM in the remaining hours of the contest put the museum back on top.

"I can't get over how passionate our visitors have been about making sure we won this award," said National Infantry Museum Foundation President COL (Ret) Greg Camp. "They were excited to tell us that they were voting every day and they made sure their friends voted, too. We can't thank everybody enough for their support and enthusiasm.
