Legendary Ranger to Sign Books at National Infantry Museum

Col. Ralph Puckett's publishes his second book, a memoir

Columbus, Georgia – April 6, 2017: COL (Ret) Ralph Puckett, a dedicated and inspirational leader in the Ranger community, will be at the National Infantry Museum Friday, April 7 and Friday, April 21 to sell and sign copies of his just-published book, *Ranger: A Soldier's Story.* The event will take place in the museum's lobby from 10 am to 2 pm on both dates.

The book recounts Puckett's extraordinary experiences on and off the battlefield, starting with his early years in Tifton, Georgia. *Ranger* goes into detail about the battle that defined Puckett's early career and propelled him as a living legend. This is his second book; the first – *Words for Warriors* – is a self-published series of short essays about various military tasks, missions and objectives.

Ranger was co-authored by military historian Dan Crosswell, who holds the COL Richard R. Hallock Distinguish University Chair in Military History at Columbus State University.
