Registration Open for NIM's Summer Camp Benning

Children 6-15 learn military history and Army values

Columbus, Georgia – April 27, 2015: Slots are filling fast for the National Infantry Museum's 2015 sessions of Summer Camp Benning. The NIM will be hosting the day camp for the sixth year in a row, with six sessions in June and July.

Each of the sessions follows a different theme to give campers a well-rounded experience in military history, teamwork, and life as a soldier. The upper level session is reserved for 8th and 9th grade students who will participate in the Counselor-In-Training course.

Fees are \$200 per camper. Some scholarships are available. Lunch is included in all but the "Boots on the Ground" session, and will be based on the rations given to Soldiers at the time period campers are studying. The 2015 sessions are as follows:

June 8-12, 2015 "Objective: The Last 100 Yards" (Ages 9-14)

Step back in time to experience the U.S. military like never before. Follow the battles from the Revolutionary War to current day engagements in Afghanistan as told through the museum's signature exhibit, *The Last 100 Yards*. This camp includes three half-days at Oxbow Meadows Environmental Learning Center, focusing on the importance of water conservation. Campers will walk in the footsteps of Soldiers, participating in reenactments and engaging with veterans about their experiences in the military.

June 15-19, 2015 "An Adventure Through Time" (Ages 10-14)

Dive deeper into each major conflict in U.S. military history. From learning about the Spanish-American War to advanced tactics that help Soldiers today stay safer and faster on the modern battlefield, campers see first-hand what it takes to secure our freedoms. Mock Vietnam reconnaissance missions will establish the importance of teamwork, leadership, and communication between campers.

June 22-26, 2015 "Boots On The Ground" (Ages 6-8)

Our youngest campers will have the opportunity to explore US military history from the Revolutionary War to WWI. This camp will introduce campers to the basics of what being a soldier is all about, while learning about what they would have experienced on a day to day basis. During their time at Oxbow Meadows Environmental Learning Center, campers will learn to be Nature Rangers, exploring wildlife, trees, and insects.

July 6-10, 2015 "Leadership Camp" (7th grade students and up)

The Army Values instill eight distinct qualities in a Soldier. Campers will leave with a greater understanding of how each is instrumental to being a great leader. Hands-on exercises will challenge campers to work as a team and make hard decisions. Strategies and principles from key military leaders will be dissected and taught how to be applied to solve daily obstacles. Local veterans will also discuss the meaning of ethics and honor. An off-site service will be conducted during the camp.

July 13-17, 2015 "Follow Me!" (Ages 11-15)

Almost every Soldier will pass through Fort Benning for training during their military career. Before it was claimed as the Home of the Infantry, Fort Benning was inhabited by Creek Indians. Learn not only how the area grew into a local treasure by exploring the Fort Benning Gallery in-depth, but also the ecology that surrounds us. Oxbow Meadows Environmental Learning Center will partner with this camp to discover local edible plants, native animals such as the Red-cockaded Woodpecker, and topography. To be a successful Soldier and citizen, one must understand the terrain!

June 1-5, 2015 *Counselor-in-Training (8th and 9th grade students only)*

A course developed for youth who are interested in becoming camp counselors at the National Infantry Museum. Candidates must have attended at least one Summer Camp Benning session a previous summer. CITs will attend staff training and one Summer Camp Session (listed above) of his/her choosing as a camper. CITs must also volunteer to work a minimum of one Summer Camp session in 2015. In addition to expanding leadership skills, CITs will discover communication techniques with peers and productive decision making processes.
