Join Elsa, Ariel, Nemo, Dory and dozens of other cherished characters **every Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday at 11 a.m. and 2 p.m.** for digital screenings of 16 different family-friendly movies on the region’s largest screen. At least one screening each week will be sensory-friendly, to accommodate kids bothered by loud noises and total darkness.

Admission is free to both children and adults; arrive early before the theater fills up! The concessions stand will be open for purchasing snacks and light lunches, including pizza, hot dogs, nachos, popcorn, candy, soda and ice cream.
